



Biker Fusion raises over \$24,000 for Soldier's Angels

SOLDIER'S Angels, an organization whose mission is "may no soldier go unloved", will benefit from \$24,000 raised by the Biker Fusion party held at The Seminole Hard Rock Roadhouse during Bike Week 2009 in Daytona.

The event, which was hosted by Bruce Rossmeyer, Sucker Punch Sally's Christian Clayton, Billy Lane and tattoo artist Ami James, featured custom bikes, industry celebrities, a photography exhibit by Michael Lichter and Josh Kurplus, and a live auction.

Ami James and Russell Mitchell took on the roles of auctioneers in the live auction of custom skateboards by Buck Wild and Hard Rock Fender Guitars

specially designed by Billy Lane and Ami James.

A highlight of the evening was when Billy Lane donated a '76 Harley Shovelhead that he had received from Vietnam veteran Bion Howard, to three-tour Vietnam veteran Leon Roy who was chosen for the honor by the Commander of the Military Order of Purple Hearts of Florida.

The event sponsors, auction and other donations, including a \$10,000 donation from Seminole Tribe of Florida leader Max Oceola, totaled over \$24,000.

All event proceeds of Biker Fusion will support the Black Hawk Medevacs Units and wounded in Afghanistan by
